Music Performance Grant Application

Performance Grants are available and awarded each semester to students interested in attending Kansas City Kansas Community College and participating in the school's award-winning music ensembles.

- 1. Application: Application forms are available in the KCKCC Music Department and through the KCKCC website. The application consists of filling out the first page form and attaching the requested performance history and letters of reference.
- 2. Selection: Grant recipients are selected after auditioning for one or more of the music faculty and upon consideration of the application. Selections are based on performance ability, cumulative high school and/or college grade point average, and level of participation in music courses and activities.
- **3. Eligibility:** Any high school senior or graduate (or GED) who has ability in instrumental and/or vocal music may apply for a Music Performance Scholarship at KCKCC. Students do not have to major in Music, Music Technology, or Audio Engineering to receive a Music Performance Grant; all students interested in participating in music at KCKCC may apply for a Music Performance Grant.
- **4. FAFSA:** All students applying for a Music Performance Scholarship <u>must</u> also fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students should list Kansas City Kansas Community College (Code: 001925) as the college they plan to attend. Doing so allows students the opportunity to receive a Federal Pell Grant, Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant, Work-Study, and/or Loan; state scholarships and grants; and/or one of many KCKCC Foundation scholarships, in addition to the Music Performance Grant.
- 5. About Music Performance Grants: These grants are offered both to help students financially and to help the KCKCC Music Department develop and maintain a strong core of dependable and talented students in all performance areas of the department. Recipients must participate in all functions of the ensembles to which they are assigned, take applied lessons each semester they are on a Performance Grant, and carry at least 12 credit hours while maintaining the GPA listed below.
- **6. Duration of Performance Grants:** Students may receive a Performance Grant for a maximum of six semesters. Students must maintain an overall grade point average of 2.5, plus a 3.0 grade point average in music classes. Grants are <u>not</u> awarded for the summer semester.
- 7. Amount: Music Performance Grants are at four levels, covering 25%, 50%, 75%, or 100% of tuition for the semester. The overall amount varies based on whether the student is from Wyandotte or Leavenworth County, in-state Kansas, within the Kansas City Metro area, or from out-of-state. The grant does not cover applied lesson fees or music technology fees.
 - a. Performance Grants may be combined with other scholarships and grants, up to a maximum combined award covering 100% of tuition per semester.
 - b. The grant does not cover applied lesson fees, music technology fees, or textbooks.
 - c. The award level may be adjusted up or down on a semester-by-semester basis (and the grant may be revoked) based on the student's academic performance, growth as a musician, and commitment to both ensembles and the Music Department as a whole.
- 8. About the KCKCC Music Department: For the past decade the KCKCC Music Department has built a national reputation for excellence in jazz and choral performance. KCKCC is considered one of the finest community colleges for music nationwide, particularly in jazz and contemporary/commercial music. Students and faculty have earned 48 *DownBeat Magazine* Student Music Awards since 2017 (more than twice as many as any other community college nationwide), and ensembles from KCKCC have been selected to perform at the Jazz Education Network National Conference (three times), the American Choral Directors National Conference, the National Association for Music Education National Conference, the American Choral Directors Association Southwestern Divisional Conference, and the Kansas Music Education Association In-Service Workshop (nine times). The faculty at KCKCC are both first-call gigging musicians in Kansas City's vibrant music performance scenes and renowned educators who regularly present at international, national, and regional conferences and workshops.
