



Women's Equality Day

KCKCC hosted its fourth annual Women's Equality Day luncheon Aug. 24, honoring Dr. Jacqueline Vietti. Vietti served as acting president at KCKCC from July 2017 to June 2018.

Women's Equality Day commemorates the granting of women the right to vote in the United States. First proposed in 1878, women known as suffragettes worked for more than 40 years to gain equal voting rights. Some would try to pass suffrage acts in individual states. Others organized parades, vigils or even hunger strikes. After President Woodrow Wilson changed his position and started supporting a woman's right to vote, other politicians soon followed his lead. On Aug. 26, 1920, the 19th Amendment to the United States Constitution was certified as law, and since 1972, every president has issued a proclamation for Women's Equality Day.



KCKCC Wins Jayhawk Volleyball Opener



KCKCC got its Jayhawk Conference season off to an impressive start Wednesday by shooting down Cloud County 3-2 in the conference opener.

The Lady Blue Devils, who are now 3-1, took command early with 25-12 and 25-14 wins. Cloud rallied for a 25-22 third set win before KCKCC closed out the contest with a solid 25-15 win.

The Blue Devils now take to the road for the first time this season, playing Friday and Saturday in the seven-state Jimmy John's Invitational hosted by Southeastern Community College in West Burlington, Iowa. The Blue Devils will play Southeastern in the tournament opener Friday at 10 a.m. and then take on North Iowa Area Community College (NIACC) at 2 p.m. On Saturday, KCKCC will play Macomb Mich.) at 8 a.m. and Iowa Lakes at 10 a.m.

Other teams in the tournament are Carl Sandburg College and John Wood, both Illinois teams; East Central Missouri; Nassau (New York); and Hawkeye Community College out of Waterloo, Iowa.

Strohman Named KCKCC Assistant Softball Coach



An outstanding outfielder in her collegiate playing days, Jenn Strohman has been named assistant softball coach at KCKCC.

A former player for new KCKCC head coach Lana Ross, Strohman also was an assistant under Ross at Fort Scott Community College last year. In addition to coaching for Fort Scott against KCKCC here last season, Strohman played competitively against the Blue Devils in her collegiate playing days.

Strohman played two years for Ross at Iowa Western Community College in Council Bluffs. A rightfielder to take advantage of a strong throwing arm, Strohman played two seasons without an error. In her two seasons,

Iowa Western compiled a 91-39 record including a 50-19 record as a sophomore. The conference leader in doubles with 27, she had an on-base percentage of .500 and was a member of the NJCAA Academic of the Year.

Strohman completed her collegiate career at Bellevue University in Bellevue, Neb. A two-year starter who earned MCAC honors, she helped the Lady Bruins reach the NAIA national tournament as a freshman. She earned a BA in Liberal Arts in 2009 and a Masters in Leadership in 2011, both from Bellevue.

For three years, she coached softball at Daniel Gross High School in Omaha, then left coaching for private business before rejoining Ross at Fort Scott last year. A native of Chino, Calif., Strohman played four years at Don Antonio Lugo High School in Chino before coming to Iowa Western to be close to family members in Nebraska and Iowa.
