Two Late Goals Let Neosho Nip Blue Devils

Neosho County scored twice in the final six minutes Tuesday to rally to a 3-1 Jayhawk Conference soccer win over KCKCC in Chanute.

The loss dropped the Blue Devil men to 3-3 heading into a big home showdown with Jayhawk Conference leader Cowley College Friday evening. The kickoff will follow a women's clash starting at 4:30 p.m.



KCKCC led 1-0 at halftime at Neosho County thanks to a goal by Reed Axthelm on an assist from Kenar Huntington at the 27:00 mark.

But Neosho tied it nine minutes into the second half on a goal by Paolo Richa assisted by Jakovljevic and then broke the tie with six minutes remaining on a goal by Renan Santos assisted by Alfie Belcher. The Panthers added their final goal with two minutes left on an unassisted kick by Alexandre Novas. Neosho goalkeeper Hugo Blanckaert had seven saves as the Blue Devils got off 12 shots. Fabian Keiblinger turned away three shots in goal for KCKCC.

Neosho Women Rally Twice to Beat KCKCC



Statistically, only Jayhawk Conference leader Butler County has given up fewer goals per game than KCKCC's women's soccer team.

Unfortunately, the Lady Blue Devils have not been able to match those statistics offensively. Limited to just five goals in their first seven games, the Blue Devils scored twice at Neosho County Tuesday only to have the Lady Panthers come from behind twice for a 3-2 win.

The loss left KCKCC 2-4-2 heading into a home re-match with Cowley College Friday at 4:30 p.m. with a men's game to follow. KCKCC and Cowley battled to a 0-0 deadlock in their first clash.

KCKCC jumped off to a 1-0 lead in the first 90 seconds at Neosho, freshman Cristina Alvarez scoring the goal on a penalty kick. Neosho tied the game 1-1 on a DaNisha Brown goal assisted by Jailene Alarcom at the 14:00 mark but the Blue Devils quickly went back ahead.

The Lady Blue Devils surged to a 25-8 opening set win only to have the Lady Cardinals rally for 25-19, 26-24 and 25-13 wins.


The loss dropped the Blue Devils to 13-9 overall and 2-5 in conference play heading into the Ramada Classic in Columbus,

Former Instructor Honored in Scholarship Fundraiser

Plans for the eighth annual Philip Miller Memorial Scholarship Reading are underway. The reading honors Phil Miller, a former Kansas City Kansas Community College faculty member known for his love of poetry and for promoting literary writing through readings.



Phil Miller taught English composition and literature at KCKCC as well as creative writing and learning center

courses from 1976 until he retired in 2002. He also co-created the Riverfront Reading Series in the mid-1980s, which still continues and is now sponsored by a committee of 13, led by poet Phyllis Becker. This year's memorial scholarship reading is at 3 p.m. Oct. 21 at the Writer's Place, 3607 Pennsylvania Ave. in Kansas City, Mo. The reading will be an open mic with the theme of "Ghosts." Participants will have the opportunity to read two poems or one long poem or can choose to read a poem of Miller's, who was an accomplished and well-published poet.

Along with the reading event, there will be a silent auction and refreshments. Donations collected will go toward the Philip Miller Scholarship fund at KCKCC. The \$500 scholarship will be awarded to at least one KCKCC student each year.

Blue Devil Golfers 6th in Difficult Porto Cima Tourney



The Club at Porto Cima proved as tough as advertised in the 2018 Porto Cima Invitational at the Lake of the Ozarks in Sunrise Beach Tuesday.

Without a player in the 70s, KCKCC had to settle for sixth place in competition with a field of four-year colleges and universities.

But the Blue Devils weren't alone. Co-medalist Zach

Chegwidden of William Penn was the only golfer to match par with a 72 in the two-day tourney. Only one other golfer broke 75 Tuesday and just a dozen broke 80. Missouri Valley took team honors despite finishing a whopping 34 strokes over par with a four-man total of 610. William Penn was second (623) followed by Culver-Stockton (630), Seminole State College (647), Baker (660), KCKCC (661) and Evangel (671).

Two freshmen led KCKCC. Garrett Clark finished in a tie for eighth (75-81-156) and Cameron Riley tied for 18th (84-80-164). Sophomore Zach Miller tied for 30th (85-87-172); freshman Garrett Scott was alone in 33rd (83-90-173); and sophomore Evin Wheeler tied for 34th (89-86-175).

Chegwidden (77-72-149) shared medalist honors with Nicholas Evangelio (74-75-149) of Missouri Valley.
