

KCKCC to Host Unique Constitution Day Event



KCKCC students, faculty and staff have the opportunity to celebrate an important moment in U.S. history during its annual observance of <u>Constitution Day</u>.

The 2018 Constitution Day Theme, "A Triumph of the Spirit" is a musical dramatization of the life and journey of the legendary Harriet Tubman. The event is at 11 a.m. Sept. 17 in the KCKCC

Performing Arts Center. The event is free and open to the public.

Shirley E. Oglesby Smith Johnson will lead the performance along with cast/crew including - Cynthia Green, Alisia Bell, Austin Bryant, William Gill, Terri Anderson, SanQuan Bell, Denise Ray, Sharon Bryant and Rosa Gill.

The nationally acclaimed play, "A Triumph of the Spirit," is a two-act play based on the life of Harriet Tubman. According to the play's website, www.atriumphofthespirit.com, it is "breathtakingly authentic, heartbreakingly sincere, and full of wittiness--this is a play that enlightens, inspires and empowers all at once.

This event is the college's official observance of Constitution Day, the annual commemoration of the ratification of the Constitution and celebration of its importance in American society. Created in 2004, Constitution Day replaced what was previously known as Citizenship Day. Federal law requires that all educational institutions that receive public funds provide some type of educational programs on the political history of the American Constitution.

KCKCC Blanks Allen County; At JCCC Friday

A 3-0 winner at Allen County Wednesday night, KCKCC swings right back into action at No. 3 ranked Johnson County Friday as the Lady Blue Devils continue their battle in the nation's toughest NJCAA Division II volleyball conference.

The Blue Devils jumped off to a quick 2-0 lead at Allen

County, winning 25-14 and 25-11 before taking a furious third set 33-31. The win boosted the Blue Devils' record to 9-5 with four of the five losses coming to teams ranked in the Top 20 nationally.

Any question as to the validity of the Jayhawk being the toughest was erased with the latest NJCAA Division II national rankings - the top three teams in the conference are also the top three teams in the national poll. Coffeyville, the defending national champion, is No. 1; Cowley College is ranked No. 2 and Johnson County No. 3.



Not only does the conference boast the top three teams, it has four teams among the top nine as Highland is ranked No. 9. In addition, KCKCC was ranked No. 17 and is still receiving votes, and Neosho County was ranked in the Top 20. In all, the Blue Devil schedule boasts 11 rivals who are in the Top 20.

Tipoff at Johnson County is 6 p.m. Friday The Blue Devils then return home next Wednesday to host Neosho County followed by the loaded KCKCC Tournament Sept. 21-22, and then a road date at No. 2 Cowley Sept. 26.

Miller, KCKCC Both Third in Ottawa Invitational



KCKCC got some improved performances in the Ottawa Invitational golf tournament Wednesday, but still had to settle for a third place finish.

Blue Devil sophomore Zach Miller missed medalist honors by a single stroke, finishing in a tie for third behind co-medalists Michael Kinkelaar of Ottawa and Cooper Spears of Southwestern, who shot identical 77-74-151s. Tied for first with a 2-over par 74 after 18 holes, Miller's 78 Wednesday left him one shot back at

152 in the tourney played at Eagle Bend Golf Club in Lawrence.

Host Ottawa took team honors with a 36-hole total of 609, seven shots in front of runnerup Southwestern (616). Tied with Rockhurst B at the halfway point, KCKCC took third at 626, five shots in front of Rockhurst. Rockhurst C took fifth at 650 followed by Kansas Wesleyan (652), Bethel (654) and Ottawa B (680).

The Blue Devils are now idle until next Tuesday and Wednesday when they compete in the Evangel Invitational at Rivercut in Springfield, Mo.

KCKCC Women Tie; Blue Devil Men Edged 2-1



Held to just one goal in 210 minutes of playing time at Cowley College Tuesday, KCKCC's young soccer teams are back home next Tuesday against arch-rival Johnson County. The women will kick off at 5 p.m.; the men at 7:30 p.m.

The KCKCC women (1-1-1) played to a 0-0 deadlock in two overtimes at Cowley while the Blue Devil men (0-2) dropped a 2-1 decision.

The Blue Devils' lone goal came in the 89th minute as Ethan Pfeifer, a sophomore midfielder from Wichita Maize, scored on a pass from sophomore defender Gustavo Palmieri. Cowley led virtually the entire contest, with Santiago Gimenez scoring just 5:17 into the game. Ignacio Palacio then clinched the win with an unassisted goal at the 85:32 mark of the second half.

KCKCC goalkeeper Fabian Keiblinger had six saves in the contest as Cowley mustered 18 shots. The Blue Devils got off 11 shots with seven shots on goal turned away.

The Lady Blue Devils got a shutout performance from freshman goalkeeper Alee Alter in the 120 minute opening women's battle. Alter had five saves as the KCKCC defense rejected a dozen Cowley shots on goal while KCKCC got off 16 shots on goal, five of which were turned away by goalkeeper Thayane Leal.
