playing days. Lutgen will work primarily with the Blue Devil middle hitters and blockers.

A 2014 graduate of Lansing High School, where she played all four years, Lutgen was a member of the 2014 Lady Blue Devil team that won the consolation bracket and finished ninth in the NJCAA national tournament in Arizona, KCKCC's first and only national tournament.

Lutgen continued her college career on an academic scholarship at Pittsburg State University, but did not play volleyball because

of her injury. A recreation major, she is finishing her degree work in an internship at the KCKCC Wellness and Fitness Center with a goal of offering recreational activities for seniors in Senior Living or Retirement homes.


Tonganoxie, Cameron Riley, of Liberal and Bryce Farlin, of Maryville, Mo.

The Blue Devils will open their season Friday in the Southwestern Iowa Invitational in Creston. A one-day event, Wheaton and Welsh will be joined by Scott, McClellan and Riley in the opener. Both Clark and Miller will miss the opener to attend the wedding Friday night of former teammate Micah Morris.

All eight of the Blue Devils will be in action Tuesday and Wednesday when they compete in the Ottawa University Invitational at Eagle Bend in Lawrence.

The Blue Devils will compete in seven tournaments this fall capped by the KCKCC Fall Invitational at Dub's Dread. The fall schedule will take them to two new courses that are among the best in the Midwest - the Culver Stockton Invitational at Porta Cima at the Lake of the Ozarks and the district preview at Wildhorse Golf Club in Gothenburg, Neb.

No. 1 Coffeyville Defeats KCKCC in 3-0 Sweep

No. 1 ranked Coffeyville was as good as advertised in a 3-0 sweep of KCKCC Tuesday night.

The defending national champions, the Red Ravens led virtually from start to finish in 25-15 and 25-14 wins before needing a late surge in a 25-18 third set victory. KCKCC led 6-3 in the third set, and it was tied 14-14 before Coffeyville pulled ahead 18-14.



It was the 10th straight win for Coffeyville, which has lost only one set in 10 matches that has included Jayhawk rivals Neosho County, Highland and Cowley; Iowa Central; Ellsworth and Southwestern. Only Lincoln Land has won a set against the Red Ravens. That came in the second match of the season. Since then, Coffeyville has swept eight matches in a row.

The win also snapped a streak of seven straight wins for KCKCC including a 4-0 sweep in

the Southeastern lowa tournament this past weekend.

The Blue Devils (7-2) now head for the annual Pasco-Hernandez Tournament to be played Friday and Saturday in New Port Richey, Fla. KCKCC then returns to Jayhawk Conference action next Wednesday, playing at Allen County at 6:30 p.m. and then Johnson County Friday at 6 p.m. Next home match comes against Neosho County Sept. 19 followed by the annual KCKCC Tournament Sept. 21-22.
