



KCKCC to Host Veterans Day Ceremony



The Kansas City Kansas Community College Veterans Center will host a Veterans Day Ceremony next week.

The ceremony is at 9 a.m. Nov. 11 in front of the Veterans Center in the Lower Jewell Building on the KCKCC Main Campus, 7250 State Ave. United States Army veteran and KCKCC employee Risala Allen will be the guest speaker. She plans to discuss what it means to her to be a military veteran.

Allen entered the Army in 2000 at Fort Jackson South Carolina, completing training as a Personnel Specialist in the Adjutant General Corps. She was then assigned to Fort Carson Colorado and served as a Personnel Information Management Systems Specialist. Allen left the military in 2003 and is currently serving as the Executive Administrative

Partner to the President and Board of Trustees at KCKCC.

Throughout the week, the KCKCC Veterans Center will be hosting a number of events to recognize and honor military and veteran students, faculty and staff at KCKCC.

Rebounds, Defense Power KCKCC Women to 3rd Win

KCKCC's young women's basketball team did something Tuesday that last year's national champions did not do - defeat Washburn University's JV at Washburn.

Fueled by a big second quarter, the Lady Blue Devils posted a 71-48 win in Topeka. It was the third straight win for the unbeaten and No. 1 ranked Blue Devils. Last season, the Lady Ichabods handed



KCKCC a 76-74 setback, one of only four KCKCC losses in 2018-19.

The Blue Devils stay on the road this weekend for what could be their toughest test of the non-conference season. KCKCC takes on Southwestern of Creston, Iowa, at 5 p.m. Friday in the first round of the Kirkwood Classic in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and then clashes with No. 2 ranked Kirkwood Saturday at 3 p.m. in a collision of the last two national champions - Kirkwood winning in 2018 and KCKCC in 2019.

KCKCC led just 13-10 after one quarter before Kamryn Estell and Aliyah Myers combined for 16 points in a 26-12 second quarter that ballooned the Blue Devil lead to 39-22 at halftime. Estell had nine points on 4-of-5 shooting while Myers added seven, taking three shots and making all three including a 3-pointer. The Blue Devils, who never trailed, led by as many as 26 points in the third quarter although shooting only 30.8 percent from the field and 22.7 percent from 3-point.

KCKCC to Host m-pact Vocal Festival Next Week



Kansas City Kansas Community College will be the site of a November music festival hosted by the Los Angeles based pop-jazz vocal group, m-pact.

The m-pact Vocal Festival is Nov. 14 and 15 at the KCKCC Performing Arts Center. A non-competitive festival, vocal jazz ensembles, contemporary a capella groups and other small choral ensembles have the opportunity to work hands-on with the award-winning group.

In addition to the master classes and workshops, m-pact will also perform in a concert with KCKCC's "The Standard" Vocal Jazz Ensemble. This concert will be at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 14 in the KCKCC

Performing Arts Center. Tickets for the concert are \$15 and can be purchased from the festival's <u>website</u>. Acaville Internet Radio, which offers a range of a cappella music through its streaming service, will be on site to <u>stream</u> the concert.

Described by the San Francisco Chronicle as "one of the best pop-jazz vocal groups in the world" m-pact is known for its sophisticated sound that has won the group Vocal Group of the Year at the L.A. Music Awards and an Indie nomination from the Independent Grammys.

The group has been named Grand National Champs of the Harmony Sweepstakes competition and has performed with artists such as Boyz II Men, Sheryl Crow, the

Woody Herman Orchestra, the Maynard Ferguson Big Band and Natalie Cole, among many others. Their "signature sound" can also be heard in television theme songs as well as Disney feature films and on radio stations throughout the world.

Started in 1995, m-pact has made five full-length albums, three EP's and several single releases and continue to receive rave reviews and multiple awards. Billboard Magazine named them the "Best Unsigned Band" and in 2014, the group joined with New York a cappella powerhouse Duwende to produce "I Wish for All Time," an a cappella tribute to Stevie Wonder and Michael Jackson. M-pact continues to thrill audiences with their innovative orchestrations and stage presence as well as their vocals as they work to stay true to the music they are performing.

Veteran Duo Lead Blue Devils to 71-58 Opening Win

With a pair of veterans leading the way, Brandon Burgette got his first win as the KCKCC men's basketball coach Tuesday.

Sophomores Cody Dortch and Calvin Slaughter combined for 38 points in leading the Blue Devils to a season-opening 71-58 win over Washburn University's JV in Topeka.



A 6-2 sophomore guard from Paragould, Ark., Dortch drained 4-of-8 3-pointers on the way to a career high 21 points; Slaughter, last year's leading scorer from Macon, Ga., had a double-double with 17 points and a game and career high 11 rebounds. Most importantly was when they got their career bests. Dortch had 18 of his 21 points in the second half; Slaughter had 11 points and seven rebounds in the final 20 minutes. Each also had three assists.

KCKCC surged to a 17-0 lead in the first 14½ minutes and led 31-21 at the half by holding the Ichabods to just five field goals in 25 attempts (.250). Meanwhile, the Blue Devils were 11-for-27 for 40.7 percent each half and 39.1 percent from 3-point for the contest. KCKCC had 17 turnovers, Washburn 19.

The Blue Devils stay on the road this weekend when they'll compete in the North Iowa Area Classic in Mason City. The Blue Devils will face host NIACC Friday at 5 p.m. and Ellsworth Saturday at 3 p.m. At Allen County Tuesday, KCKCC plays its opening home games in the Keith Lindsey Classic, hosting Cowley County on Nov. 15, and North Central Missouri Nov. 16.

KCKCC Soccer Season Ends with Loss to JCCC

The best women's soccer season in KCKCC history has come to an end.

Avenging two regular season losses, Johnson County eliminated the Lady Blue Devils from the Region VI playoffs with a 2-0 win Nov. 1. The loss was just the fourth in 17 games for the Blue Devils (13-4), the first winning season in the 8-year history of the sport at KCKCC.

A 2-1 upset winner over No. 1 seeded Cloud County in the opening round of playoffs, the win was the fifth in a row for the No. 8 seeded Cavaliers (13-6-1).

The Cavaliers jumped in front when Audrey Peterson lofted in a goal from outside the box at the 15:11 mark of the first half and then clinched the win when Morgan Carranza converted a penalty kick with 16:59 remaining in the game.

The shutout was the sixth of the season for Cavaliers, who have given up only 20 goals in 20 games this season. The Blue Devils launched 12 kicks and 10 corner kicks on JCCC goalkeeper Oliva Ways, who had seven saves in recording the shutout.

Jaidyn Takaishi had nine saves in goal for the Blue Devils as the Cavaliers had a 19-12 advantage in shots.




