

KCKCC to Host m-pact Vocal Festival This November



KCKCC will be the site of a November music festival hosted by the Los Angeles based pop-jazz vocal group, m-pact.

The m-pact Vocal Festival is Nov. 14 and 15 at the KCKCC Performing Arts Center. A non-competitive festival, vocal jazz ensembles, contemporary a capella groups and other small choral ensembles have the opportunity to work hands-on with the award-winning group.

In addition to the master classes and workshops, m-pact will also perform in a concert with KCKCC's "The Standard" Vocal Jazz Ensemble. This concert will be at 7:30 p.m. Nov. 14 in the KCKCC Performing Arts Center. Tickets for the concert are \$15 and can be purchased from the festival's website. Acaville Internet Radio, which offers a range of a cappella music through its streaming service, will be on site to stream the concert.

Described by the San Francisco Chronicle as "one of the best pop-jazz vocal groups in the world" m-pact is known for its sophisticated sound that has won the group Vocal Group of the Year at the L.A. Music Awards and an Indie nomination from the Independent Grammys.

KCKCC Volleyball Cruises to a 3-0 Win Over Labette


KCKCC can make a strong claim for being the best unranked volleyball team in the Jayhawk Conference.

Unfortunately, that still leaves the Lady Blue Devils as the seventh best team and in eighth place in the current conference standings.

A decisive 3-0 home court winner over Labette Wednesday, the Blue Devils improved to 3-4 in conference play and 14-10 overall but they still remain a half-game behind Allen County (3-3) for seventh place in the Jayhawk with three contests to play. KCKCC does hold the tie-breaker over Allen by virtue of a 3-1 win.

KCKCC is back on the road Monday at Fort Scott and after a weekend in the Lincoln Land tournament in Springfield, Ill., the Blue Devils go to Highland Oct. 23 and finish at home against Hesston in the annual Sophomore Game Oct. 30.

Ranked No. 2 nationally, Coffeyville (6-0) leads the conference followed by No. 6 Fort Scott (6-1), No. 4 Cowley (5-1), No. 7 Johnson County (5-2), No.10 Highland (3-3) and No. 13 Cloud County (3-3). Against all foes, the six ranked teams are 140-25.

Win Puts Blue Devils in Position for High Jayhawk Finish



KCKCC made an early 2-0 lead stand up for a vital 2-1 win over Neosho County Tuesday night.

The win pulled the Blue Devils into a tie with Neosho for third place in the Jayhawk Conference with a chance to climb even higher with three games remaining starting Friday when KCKCC hosts Johnson County in a 5 and 7:30 p.m. doubleheader.

Cowley College leads the conference at 5-1-1 followed by

Johnson County (4-1-1), KCKCC (4-3)

and Neosho (4-3), Allen County (3-5) and Coffeyville (0-7). In addition to JCCC Friday, the Blue Devils play at Allen County next Wednesday and host Coffeyville Sunday, Oct. 20. Johnson County has games remaining against Cowley, KCKCC, Coffeyville and Neosho while Neosho faces Allen County, Cowley and JCCC in its remaining three contests.


KCKCC's 2-1 win over Neosho was the second 2-1 win over the Panthers and earned the tie-breaker in case of a tie. Also, it was only the third loss of the season for Neosho (10-3).

The Blue Devils grabbed a 1-0 lead in the first four minutes on a goal by sophomore midfielder Alejandro Maillet on an assist from freshman Elijah Bathily and then got what proved to be the winning goal from sophomore Ignacia Sarasol, who took a free kick in front of the net from freshman Lucas Santos and beat the goalkeeper with a thunderous kick.

Blue Devils Finish 4th in KCKCC Invitational

A season long bugaboo caught up with KCKCC's young golf team Tuesday.

Second after Monday's first round of the Blue Devil Invitational, the Blue Devils had to settle for fourth in the tournament played at Dub's Dread Golf Club.

Led by the team's lone sophomore, Cameron Riley of Liberal, Kan., the Blue Devils trailed Hutchinson by just three strokes after the first round (304-307) but then fell back to fourth with a 327 Tuesday. Hutchinson finished first (608) followed by Washburn B, 618; Rockhurst B, 632; KCKCC, 634; Barton County, 635 and Bethel College, 699.

Riley (72-77-149) finished second after sharing the first round lead with medalist Charlie Crockett (72-72-144), of Hutchinson, Kan., both matching par with 72's.

Dylan Freund (75-84-159), of Cheney, finished 17^{th;} Jacob Hall, (80-82-162) of Tonganoxie, tied for 20^{th;} Mark Towey (80-84- 164), of Bishop Carroll tied for 23^{rd;} Kellen Welsh (83-83- 165), of Olathe West was 25th and Keegan Ellington (83-88-171), of Andover Central placed 31st.

The Blue Devils close out the fall season Monday and Tuesday in the Tabor Invitational at Sandcreek Station in Newton, the site of next spring's annual Jayhawk Conference championship.

Cowley Loss Dims KCKCC Women's Title Hopes

KCKCC will need help to return to the top of the Jayhawk Conference women's soccer standings.


A 5-2 loss at first place Cowley College (7-1) Saturday dropped the 16th ranked Blue Devils (6-3) two losses back in the standings with three games to go. KCKCC dealt Cowley its only conference loss 2-1 in the first meeting of the two teams.



KCKCC's two remaining home games are against teams right on the Blue Devils' heels, Johnson County (5-3) Friday at 5 p.m. and Coffeyville (5-3) Sunday, Oct. 20. The Lady Blue Devils lone road game is at Allen County (0-9) Oct. 16. Meanwhile, Cowley has a makeup game with No. 13 ranked Butler County (4-3-1) and regularly scheduled games at JCCC and Coffeyville and a home contest with Neosho.

Two early Cowley goals put the Blue Devils (9-2-1) in a hole from which they could not escape. Kayley Pedersen, a freshman midfielder from SM West, got KCKCC back in contention when she bent in a corner kick late in the half but three second half Tiger goals were too much to overcome. Freshman forward Madison Broeker got KCKCC's second goal when she scored off a Pedersen corner kick.

Cowley, which is 9-2 overall, leads the Jayhawk at 7-1 followed by KCKCC, 6-3; JCCC and Coffeyville, both 5-3; Butler, 4-3-1; Neosho, 1-6-1 and Allen, 0-9.
