



Home Playoff Berth, Possible Title On Line for KCKCC

KCKCC's women's soccer season comes down to a dramatic showdown against Coffeyville Sunday afternoon at 2 p.m.

On the line - hosting KCKCC's first ever NJCAA DII Region VI playoff game and a possible first place tie in the Jayhawk Conference race.

In second place in the Jayhawk after a 5-2 win at Allen County Wednesday, a win over Coffeyville would not only clinch a home playoff berth but it would put the Blue Devils (8-3) in position to tie Cowley College for the conference championship should Cowley (9-2) lose at Butler next Tuesday. Conversely, a loss and two Butler (6-3-1) wins would drop KCKCC to third place and force a playoff opener on the road.



In Coffeyville, the Blue Devils will be facing one of the most dangerous teams in the conference. The Red Ravens (6-5) dealt the Blue Devils one of their three losses 5-3 at Coffeyville Sept. 25 and are coming off a 2-1 upset of Cowley last Saturday.

Meanwhile, KCKCC had to pull away in the second half for the 5-2 win over winless Allen County (0-10) Wednesday. Sophomore Kayla Deaver led the way with a three-goal "hat trick" and a pivotal assist.

KCKCC led 1-0 at halftime on a Tina Alvarez pass to Deaver, who scored from the top of the box. Deaver scored again early in the second half on an assist from Maddy Broeker only to have Allen County pull even on the second of two goals by Dorothy Usher.

KCKCC Men's Soccer Playoff Berth Clinched

KCKCC officially wrapped up a men's soccer playoff berth with a 2-1 win at Allen County Wednesday - and stayed in position for a possible home playoff spot.

Solidly in third place at 5-3-1, the Blue Devils trail second place Johnson County (5-1-2) by a single point in the NJCAA DI playoff



standings. A win in their home finale against Coffeyville Sunday afternoon (4 p.m.) and JCCC losses to Cowley College and Neosho County would vault the Blue Devils into second place in the East and a home playoff berth.

Two goals in a span of three minutes of the first half put the Blue Devils in front and a stingy defense made them hold up at Allen County, blanking the Red Devils until the final seven minutes when Jordan Mase scored an unassisted goal.

Freshman Leonardo Bonelli scored KCKCC's first goal in the 32nd minute when he took a pass from freshman Elijah Bathily and rifled a shot home from 21 yards out. Bathily then made it 2-0 three minutes later when he scored on a corner kick by freshman Lucas Santos.

Despite Injured Leg, KCKCC's Cam Riley Places 4th

Even on one leg, KCKCC's Cameron Riley played better than nearly the entire field in the Tabor College Fall Golf Invitational.

A sophomore from Liberal, Riley finished fourth in the Blue Devils' final tournament of the fall season played at Sand Creek Station in Newton Monday and Tuesday. Riley's 75-73-148 trailed three golfers from tourney champion Indian Hills, two of whom finished under par. Harry Doig and Harry Fearn each fired 2-under par 142's with Cyril Henault one shot ahead of Riley at 147. No other golfer in the field of 50 finished better than 151, three shots back of Riley, who was sixth after Monday's round.

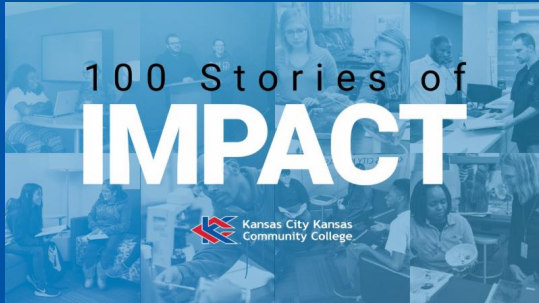
The medalist in the season opening Swedes Invitational hosted by Bethany College in Salina, Riley finished in the Top Five in four of KCKCC's six fall tournaments - all of which had a bevy of Blue Devil followers.

Trailing Tabor by two shots (335-337) after Monday's 18 holes, the Blue Devils knocked nine shots off their opening round for a 337-328-665 finish that vaulted them past Tabor into seventh place but left them a shot back of sixth place Sterling.



Keegan Ellington (84-81-165), of Andover Central, finished in a tie for 28th for KCKCC while Mark Towey (84-84-168), of Bishop Carroll, finished 32nd; Dylan Freund (89-86-175), of Cheney, 40th; Jacob Hall (81-85-176), of Tonganoxie, 41st and Kellen Welsh, of Olathe West, (89-89-178) 44th. All are freshmen.

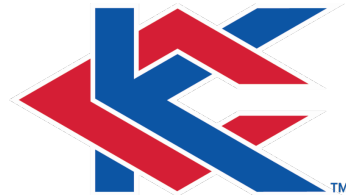

KCKCC Selected to Lead New Entrepreneurship Initiative

Kansas City Kansas Community College and the Kansas City, Kan. community will be a part of creating an innovative entrepreneurial environment thanks to NetWork Kansas' Entrepreneurship Community Partnership.



KCK was one of five communities selected by NetWork Kansas this year for the E-Community Partnership. KCKCC's Entrepreneurship & Workforce Department was one of the 2019 applicants and will be the location of the program in KCK as well as serve as a co-leader in the process. Other co-leaders include Kira Hopkins, CEO of Entrepreneur Business Basics and Donnetta Watson, CEO of the National Black MasterMind Group. The partnership will be formally announced Friday during the KCK Entrepreneurship Workgroup.

The E-Community partnership, now in its 12th year, has grown to include more than 60 communities, providing \$18.9 million to businesses and leveraging an additional \$88.1

million. This funding has spurred the creation or retention of thousands of jobs in these communities and has immeasurable positive effects on the entrepreneurial ecosystems of these participating areas.

As an E-Community, KCKCC and KCK will be allocated an amount of gap financing funds to be loaned to local businesses. They will also be able to participate in NetWork Kansas board certified programs such as Ice House Entrepreneurial Mindset, Destination Boot Camp and Youth Entrepreneurship Challenge, ultimately creating a dynamic entrepreneurial environment.
