## KCKCC Women Beat No. 20 Cowley County



A dramatic goal with 19.2 seconds left has given KCKCC its first women's soccer win over a national ranked team and thrust the Blue Devils into the thick of the Jayhawk Conference season.

Kayley Pedersen, a freshman midfielder from Shawnee Mission West, launched the game winner from outside the box that sailed over the outstretched arm of

goalkeeper Lotta Dulva for a 2-1 win over No. 20 ranked Cowley College Wednesday.

The last-minute win boosted the Blue Devils' record to 4-1 overall and 2-1 in what shapes up as a wild Jayhawk Conference race. Cowley came into the game off a 1-0 win over Butler County, which had handed KCKCC its only loss 3-2 with 5.9 seconds left in overtime. Butler then dealt Johnson County its first conference loss 1-0 Wednesday. Only Coffeyville is unbeaten at 2-0 but the Red Ravens face Butler, Cowley and JCCC in its their next three contests.

The Blue Devils step out of conference play Saturday when they play Metropolitan Community College at Blue River at 11:30 a.m. before resuming conference action at Johnson County next Wednesday at 5 p.m.

# **KCKCC Golf Finishes Second in Golf Opener**

Led by a spectacular performance by medalist Cameron Riley, KCKCC's young golf team got the fall season off to an outstanding start.

The Blue Devils' lone sophomore, Riley put together three rounds in the 60s to claim medalist honors in the Swedes Invitational hosted by Bethany College at the Salina Municipal Golf Course Monday and Tuesday. A graduate of Liberal High School, Riley took the tournament lead with rounds of 69 and 66 on Monday and then added a 69 on Tuesday on Salina's par 70 layout. His 6-under par 204 was two shots better than Zach Willard of



Bethany.

The 204 also helped the Blue Devils finish in second place behind host Bethany, which finished at 854. The Blue Devils (868) were next followed by Barton County (877), Hastings (896), York College (904) and Bethel (313).


The tournament was the first for five KCKCC freshmen, who got their collegiate careers started with some outstanding rounds. Keegan Riley, of Andover Central, had a one-under par 69 in the second round Monday in tying for 11<sup>th</sup> (73-69-78-220), while Jacob Hall, of Piper, had his best competitive round of one-over 71 in tying for 13<sup>th</sup> (73-77-71-221). Dylen Freund, of Cheney, closed with back-to-back 72s in tying for 23<sup>rd</sup> (81-72-72-225); Mark Towey, of Bishop Carroll, placed 32<sup>nd</sup> (78-79-74-231) and Kellen Welsh, of Olathe West, finished 37<sup>th</sup> (79-77-79-235).

The Blue Devils are back in action next Monday and Tuesday in the Evangel University Invitational at Rivercut Golf course in Springfield, Mo.

## Sign-up Now for KCKCC's Walk Across Kansas

KCKCC is once again inviting students, faculty, staff and community members to participate in the Walk Across Kansas Incentive Program.

The goal of the eight-week program is to improve the health and wellness of each participant by "walking" enough miles to travel across the state of Kansas. Teams will include four people and starting Sept. 23, each team member will complete at least two miles of walking/jogging/running per day. This will equate to eight miles per team each day,



seven days a week or 448 miles by the end of the program. If a person needs to substitute an alternative cardiovascular activity, they may do so by choosing from the activity equivalent list.

The theme of this year's event is Kansas Tourist Attractions. Teams will have the option to name themselves according to a Kansas Tourist Attraction such as "Rolling with the Big Ball of Twine."

Participants can do more or less during the Walk Across Kansas program, but can turn in no more than 21 miles per week. Those who participate should remember that the team is counting on each member to reach their goal of 448 miles by the time the program ends Nov. 17. Individuals will turn in weekly mileage tracking sheets, so that the team

# No. 3 JCCC Foils KCKCC Home Volleyball Opener

Playing two of the top three volleyball teams in the nation in a span of three days is an overwhelming task for just about any team - but especially to a team that opened the season with its first 11 matches on the road.

Such was the fate of KCKCC. Beaten 3-0 at Coffeyville Monday night, No. 3 Johnson County ruined the Blue Devils' long awaited home opener with a 3-0 win Wednesday night.



The loss left the Blue Devils 6-6 overall with five of the six losses to nationally ranked teams heading into a much needed week-long layoff. They'll return to action next Wednesday, entertaining Allen County at 6:30 p.m. and then hosting the eight-team KCKCC Tournament, a tournament that will be highlighted by a KCKCC-Coffeyville rematch.

Despite a raucous KCKCC home crowd, Johnson County never trailed in posting 25-19 and 25-21 wins in the first two sets. The Blue Devils led briefly in the third set but the Cavaliers pulled away down the stretch after a 14-14 tie.

#### No. 13 Cowley Hands Blue Devils First Jayhawk Loss



KCKCC had seven shots on goal in the second half alone against nationally ranked Cowley College Wednesday. Unfortunately, none found the net.

The loss evened KCKCC's record at 2-2-1 overall and 1-1 in the Jayhawk Conference heading into a collision with Johnson County (3-2) in

Overland Park next Wednesday afternoon at 4:30 p.m.

Cowley County, meanwhile, took over the Jayhawk lead at 2-0, ahead of runnerup JCCC (1-0) and third place KCKCC and Neosho County, both 1-1.

Cowley grabbed a 1-0 lead 27 minutes into the game on Elluan Martins Gomes' eighth goal of the season. The goal was assisted by Murilo Ramos.

KCKCC pulled even with four minutes left in the half when sophomore Ignacio Sarasol scored off a corner kick from Wyandotte freshman Jorge Fernandez. Cowley's winning goal came with 21 minutes remaining, Ramos scoring on an assist from Hikaru Tanaka.

The US Constitution creates three separate, but equal branches of government. The division of responsibilities provides checks and balances against tyranny? Is the system broken? Have the lines become too blurred?


