Below is a list of suggestions that were selected:

- Add an area on the website where employees are identified and grouped by department. Anonymous.
- Include a student photo with student IDs in Blackboard to make it easier for instructors to connect students' names with faces. Dr. Doris Daniels.
- Install an outdoor sign near the Lodge by the Lake that has a campus map and available walking trails; utilizing money raised through the annual Blue Devil 5K and Kids Trot. Joseph Mundt.
- With the multiple locations KCKCC offers courses, and with the addition of courses to be offered at business locations, examine how KCKCC is currently using section numbers to identify course location. Lisa Gammon.

Promising Freshmen Carry Blue Devil Golf Hopes

KCKCC's young golf team is going to be thrust into the thick of competitive college golf in a hurry.

One sophomore and five freshmen will open the Blue Devils' fall schedule when they'll compete in Bethany College's 54-hole Swedes Invitational Monday and Tuesday at Salina Municipal Golf Course.

Hastings, Bethel, York, Kansas Wesleyan, Bethany and perennial Jayhawk Conference power Barton County Community College will join KCKCC in the opener.



Four of the five freshmen have state tournament experience including two state champions - Keegan Ellington, of Andover Central and Mark Towey, of Wichita Bishop Carroll. Ellington won the Class 5A state championship as a junior in leading Andover Central to back-to-back state titles in 2018-19 while Towey won the Class 4A state championship last spring.

The Blue Devils will be competing almost exclusively against four-year college and university teams in their six-tournament fall schedule which will include hosting the Blue Devil Invitational at Dub's Dread Oct. 7-8.

Sign-up Now for KCKCC's Walk Across Kansas



KCKCC is once again inviting students, faculty, staff and community members to participate in the Walk Across Kansas Incentive Program.

The goal of the eight-week program is to improve the health and wellness of each participant by "walking" enough miles to travel across the state of Kansas. Teams will include four people and starting Sept. 23, each team member will complete at least two miles of walking/jogging/running per day. This will equate to eight miles per team each day, seven days a week or 448 miles by the end of the program. If a person needs to substitute an alternative cardiovascular activity, they may do so by choosing from the activity equivalent list.

The theme of this year's event is Kansas Tourist Attractions. Teams will have the option to name themselves according to a Kansas Tourist Attraction such as "Rolling with the Big Ball of Twine."

Participants can do more or less during the Walk Across Kansas program, but can turn in no more than 21 miles per week. Those who participate should remember that the team is counting on each member to reach their goal of 448 miles by the time the program ends Nov. 17. Individuals will turn in weekly mileage tracking sheets, so that the team progress can be displayed in the KCKCC Wellness & Fitness Center. No. 4 Butler Women Escape KCKCC in Overtime

As losses go, KCKCC's 3-2 overtime loss to nationally ranked Butler County Wednesday night was as painful as they come.

Butler came into the contest ranked No. 4 by the U.S. Soccer Coaches Assn. and No. 5 by the NJCAA, but it was the underdog Lady Blue Devils who led much of the game.

Butler's tying goal came with just 12:51 remaining on a 45-yard free kick that hit off the hands of KCKCC goalkeeper Jaidyn Takaishi and bounced behind her to Sandra Thiman, who had an open net for the



score. Then to add insult to injury, the Grizzlies won it with 5.9 seconds remaining in the first extra period on a 35-yard missile from Maizi Garwood, a freshman from Brentwood, England.

The loss was the first in three starts for the Blue Devils, who resume Jayhawk Conference action Saturday in a 5 p.m. doubleheader against Neosho County in Chanute. The win was the fourth in a row for Butler (6-1).

Blue Devils Nip Iowa Central in 2-1 in Overtime

As wins go, they don't get much better than KCKCC's extra period 2-1 win over Iowa Central Sunday.

Alejandro Maillet, a sophomore midfielder from Copenhagen, Denmark, headed home the game winner in the opening three minutes of overtime to give the Blue Devils (1-1-1) their first win of the season. The game-winner came on an assist from Cheslyn Ashby, a freshman from Johannesburg, South Africa.

The 'Golden Goal' set off a long and wild celebration as the entire squad engulfed Maillet and Ashby.



KCKCC took an early lead on a goal by sophomore Marco Cabral on an assist from freshman Elijah Bathily only to have Iowa Central tie it a few minutes later and the contest turned in to an exhausting defensive battle.

KCKCC Volleyball Falls 3-1 to Cloud County

Just how good is the volleyball in the Jayhawk Conference? Based on KCKCC's 3-1 loss to Cloud County in Concordia Wednesday night, it may be at an all-time best.

Capitalizing on an 11-0 run, Cloud took a 25-12 decision in the opening set, but the Blue Devils bounced back for a 25-22 second set win only to have the Thunderbirds close out the match with 25-19, 25-22 decisions.



The Blue Devils also took an early lead in the fourth set, but in front of an enthusiastic home crowd, the T-Birds rode three big blocks to hold on for the 25-22 win.

KCKCC will take a 6-4 record to Coffeyville Monday at 6:30 p.m. despite not playing a home match. The six victories include wins over No. 4 Kirkwood and No. 17 Illinois Central and a loss to No. 1 Parkland.

The Blue Devils will finally return after 13 contests on the road next Wednesday when they host Johnson County at 6:30 p.m. They will also entertain Allen County Tuesday, Sept. 17, and then host the 8-team KCKCC Tournament Sept. 20-21.

Five Jayhawk teams are ranked in the top eight in the NJCAA poll. Cloud County is ranked No. 14, and with wins over two nationally ranked opponents, the Blue Devils come in at No. 20. Defending national champion Coffeyville, KCKCC's next opponent, is No. 2, followed by No. 3 Johnson County, No. 4 Highland, No. 7 Cowley and No. 8 Fort
