Students who take this course, can either focus on their own assistive technology needs or obtain an overview of assistive technology that can be used in their own career field. i.e. occupational therapy or education.

These include but are not limited to: lecture, multimedia, cooperative/collaborative learning, labs and demonstrations, projects and presentations, speeches, debates, panels, conferencing, performances, and learning experiences outside the classroom. Methodology will be selected to best meet student needs.
