This course places emphasis on examining the leadership, management and supervision techniques used in police organizations. This will include the administration, functions and development of such items as policies, procedures, rules and regulations that govern the operation of the police. Further, emphasis will be on planning, problem solving, public intervention, training, inspection and control, and field supervision techniques for various bureaus, divisions, and units within law enforcement agencies.
