### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Preschool Child II focuses on the development, implementation and assessment of appropriate environments and curricula for young children ages three through five. Students prepare to utilize developmentally appropriate practices in a context of family and culturally sensitive care. Emphasis is on understanding children's developmental stages and developing appropriate learning opportunities, interactions and environments in the following areas: dramatic play, art, music, fine and gross motor play. Course requires 15 hours. out of class experiences in programs serving children 3 to 5 years of age. Primary settings with NAEYC accreditation, or licensed early childhood programs for family, group, center, Head Start, faith - based, pre-k or nursery school setting must be approved by coordinator
