COURSE DESCRIPTION

The Student Teaching B-PreK course provides students the opportunity to demonstrate their knowledge of teaching young children in a context of cultural, linguistic, and ability diversity. The student teaching experience will occur in with children of age groups between birth to five in an inclusive setting. The course requires seminar attendance and 300 hours (20 hrs/wk) of field experiences in a primary setting with NAEYC accreditation, public funded or private pre-k or Head Start setting. Placement to be arranged in coordination and with permission of program coordinator.

METHODS OF INSTRUCTION

COURSE OUTLINE

- II. Student teacher takes partial responsibility of the class
- III. Student takes full responsibility for the class
- IV. Transfer of the responsibility from student back to cooperating teacher
