## **COURSE COMPETENCIES:**

The learner will be able to actively participate in level-appropriate informal discourse.

- 1. Be able to follow along with/read while listening to simple texts.
- 2. Be able to follow simple oral directions/instructions.
- 3. Be able to follow simple oral explanations.
- 4. Build confidence and fluency by actively participating in conversational English, including greetings, invitations, apologies, etc.

The learner will be able to actively participate in level-appropriate academic discourse using academic knowledge and critical thinking skills.

- 5. Be able to participate in classroom discussions by asking and answering specific, topic-related questions.
- 6. Be able to identify the topic and main ideas in a level-appropriate English listening activity.
- Be able to identify important details in a level-appropriate English listening activity.

The learner will learn and use notetaking techniques and strategies.

8. Be able to write down specific words/synonyms or items from a category based on a listening activity (e.g., "Write down all of the animals discussed.")

The learner will be able to understand and use level-appropriate vocabulary in spoken contexts.

- 9. Be able to recognize new target words in the context of a listening activity.
- 10. Be able to use new target words in speech and/or writing.

The learner will be able to prepare and give level-appropriate formal oral presentations.

11. Prepare and give at least 4 brief presentations about personal topics using only minimal notes.

The learner will be able to use level-appropriate grammar in spoken contexts.

- 12. Be able to understand and use targeted grammar points in practice activities and classroom discussions.
- 13. Be able to use grammatical structures consistent with emerging Level 1 proficiency in formal and informal speech. (See Level 1 Grammar course outcomes/competencies)

The learner will be able to monitor and improve his/her pronunciation and intonation.

- 14. Be able to pronounce the regular past tense ending /t/, /d/, and /id/.
- 15. Be able to pronounce long and short vowel sounds.
- 16. Be able to identify the number of syllables in familiar words.
- 17. Be able to correctly identify syllable stress and use it correctly with target words.
- 18. Be able to recognize and produce various phrase- and sentence-level intonation patterns (including statements, questions, tag questions, content vs. function words, and emphasis).
- 19. Show improvement in comprehensibility of pronunciation.

The learner will improve fluency in oral communication in level-appropriate contexts.

20. Complete impromptu or informal speaking tasks (such as audio journals or inclass tasks) about everyday personal topics such as family, school, and work with moderate pauses or hesitations.
