- 8. Be able to explain or re-tell the story of a text using level-appropriate original language.
- 9. Be able to make predictions based on previewing, context, and prior knowledge
- 10. Be able to take notes by completing an infographic based on a text.

The learner will develop vocabulary skills to enhance reading ability.

- 11. Be able to use an English dictionary to understand unfamiliar words when appropriate.
- 12. Increase passive vocabulary knowledge by demonstrating ability to choose correct definitions or synonyms for selected target vocabulary from texts.
- 13. Increase active vocabulary knowledge by being able to correctly use selected new target words and phrases from texts.
