- 4. Select or provide an appropriate new vocabulary word within longer examples and texts.
- 5. Identify synonyms or short definitions for selected basic high-frequency academic words and phrases.

The learner will demonstrate knowledge of word forms, word parts, and parts of speech to recognize and appropriately use new vocabulary.

- 6. Identify nouns and noun forms of new words.
- 7. Identify verbs and verb forms of new words.
- 8. Identify adjectives and adjective forms of new words.
- 9. Identify adverbs and adverb forms of new words.
- 10. Identify common word roots, prefixes, and affixes.

The learner will be able to use effective strategies for learning and retaining new academic vocabulary words and phrases.

- 11. Experiment with various vocabulary study methods, such as writing examples, using flashcards, creating vocabulary notebooks, or using online study/review tools.
- 12. Develop habits and a personal system to learn and review new vocabulary.
- 13. Use an English dictionary to determine correct meaning of academic vocabulary.
