COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Psychology is the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. This course focuses on the essentials of scientific reasoning, basic research methods, assessing validity and reliability, and basic conventions in the science of psychology. Students will also demonstrate (both verbally and in written form, using APA guidelines) peer reviewed studies. Students will be required to evaluate purported scientific claims made by popular media on behalf of specific products. An overarching goal of this goal will be possessing the necessary intellectual tools to distinguish amongst psychological science, pseudoscience, and non-scientific knowledge. Permeating throughout this course will be the ethical responsibilities and codes of conduct relevant to psychological research.
