  - 12. The student will be able to determine the nature of the data that must be collected for the topic in question.
  - 13. The student will be able to recognize and identify contradictory arguments and data on the topic in question.
  - 14. The student will be able to present his/her research findings in a logically coherent fashion both orally and in writing.
  - 15. The student will be able to support his/her thesis with the use of appropriate statistics.
  - 16. The student will be able to make a distinction between a valid and a faulty generalization.

- 18. The student will be able to use the method of cross-referencing in order to enhance his/her sources of information on the same topic.

- 21. The student will be able to use the method of interlibrary loan.
