Emporia State University and Kansas City Kansas Community College


Bachelor of Science in Education – Elementary Education

The purpose of this 2+2 Articulation Agreement is to facilitate the transition of students who have completed an associate's degree from Kansas City Kansas Community College to Emporia State University for the purpose of completing the Bachelor of Science in Education (Elementary Education Major) at ESU. In order to maximize the learning opportunities at both institutions and to provide a seamless transfer process for students, Emporia State University and Kansas City Kansas Community College have entered into this Agreement, effective with the 2016-17 academic year.

The Agreement enables a student who follows the accompanying four-year academic plan to earn the Bachelor of Science in Education (Elementary Education Major) degree through two years of full-time study at each institution.

The partnering institutions further agree to encourage qualified students to participate in the articulation program through advisement and dissemination of information.
