

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN
Kansas City Kansas Community College
Associate in Science in Liberal Arts & Sciences, Pre-Exercise Science
Program
and
The University of Kansas
School of Education, Department of Health, Sport, and Exercise Sciences-
Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science Program

Article I
Agreement on Principle

Kansas City Kansas Community College [KCKCC] and the University of Kansas agree that students, who choose to transfer from a community college to a 4-year college or university to earn a bachelor's degree, should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, KCKCC and the University of Kansas [KU] agree to enter into this curriculum articulation agreement for students who complete the Associate in Science in Liberal Arts & Sciences Degree in Pre-Exercise Science at KCKCC and transfer to KU to complete the Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science. Both institutions enter into this agreement as cooperating, equal partners who shall maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Article II
Agreement on Program Specifics

Kansas City Kansas Community College and the University of Kansas agree that any student who has successfully completed the minimum requirements outlined on the attached articulation guide may transfer the course credits indicated toward a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science at the University of Kansas. Students who follow this articulated program agreement must apply and be admitted to the University of Kansas. KCKCC students will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission and financial aid. The bachelor's degree graduation requirements for students who follow this articulated program agreement are listed on the attached articulation guide.

Article III
Agreement on Communication

Kansas City Kansas Community College and the University of Kansas agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified

students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to students and prospective students.

Article IV
Maintenance and Review Procedures

At least one administrative or faculty member from each institution will be appointed to act as agents for the implementation of this agreement, to speak for the institutions and to communicate changes to respective faculty members, advisors, counselors, and others to whom the information is pertinent. Responsibility for oversight of this agreement rests with the Vice President of Academic Affairs at Kansas City Kansas Community College and the Vice Chancellor at the University of Kansas. Both parties agree to communicate annually any changes in their respective programs that may affect this articulation agreement. During the third year, both parties will review the agreement for revision and possible renewal. If the agreement is not renewed by the end of the effective period, KCKCC students who started the articulated program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given three additional years to be admitted to KU under terms of this agreement.

This agreement is effective as of April 11, 2014.

Students, who began KCKCC's program prior to the effective date of this agreement, may use the agreement to the extent that the program requirements followed are consistent with this agreement.


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
We the representatives of Kansas City Kansas Community College and the University of Kansas agree to the terms of this agreement, which will be for an initial period of three (3) years.



UNIVERSITY OF KANSAS, ARTICULATION GUIDE

April 11, 2014

Kansas City Kansas Community College–Pre-Exercise Science program University of Kansas – Exercise Science program

Purpose:

This articulation agreement was developed to provide a smooth curriculum transition for students who want to earn an associate degree from KCKCC and transfer to KU to earn a Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science. The agreement is designed to minimize loss of credits and duplication of coursework in transferring. With the 2+2 Exercise Science Completion Program, students will complete the required coursework for earning an Associate in Science in Pre-Exercise Science and then transfer to KU to complete the upper-level courses to obtain the Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science. The courses to be transferred are outlined in the attached transfer guide.

Requirements:

1. Complete the Associate in Science in Liberal Arts & Sciences Degree in Pre-Exercise Science at Kansas City Kansas Community College and the coordinated program of study for the Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science at KU as indicated in this articulation guide. Any course substitutions should be made with the guidance of an advisor or counselor to assure that all requirements are met.
2. Only courses with a grade of C or better (on a 4.0 scale) will be accepted for transfer to KU. If a KCKCC course has more credits than the KU equivalent course, the additional credits will be included in the program total as general transfer credit.
3. Specific admission requirements to the University of Kansas are outlined at www.admissions.ku.edu.
4. Specific program requirements for the University of Kansas School of Education and Exercise Science Program are indicated on the attached transfer guide.
5. Program admission requirements include:
 - a. Minimum overall and admission requirement GPAs of **2.75** required (includes all transfer hours).
 - b. Effective Fall 2014, transfer grades of “D” or below will not be accepted.
 - c. Once admitted, all courses on program sheet must be completed to graduate. This major requires **120** hours.
 - d. Students must have School of Education approval to substitute any course.
 - e. The deadline to apply to this major is mid-February and mid-September. Check www.soe.ku.edu for more information.
6. Students should meet with the KU School of Education or Exercise Science advisor early, before completing an admission application to KU. A copy of the articulation guide should be brought to all advising sessions. Copies of this agreement are available at www.admissions.ku.edu.

Effective Dates: April 11, 2014 until April 10, 2019. If this agreement is not renewed at the end of the effective period, students who already started this articulated program at

KCKCC will be given three additional years to be admitted to KU under the terms of this agreement. Students, who began the program prior to the effective date, may use the agreement to the extent that the requirements completed are consistent with this agreement.
