

Articulation Agreement

KANSAS CITY KANSAS COMMUNITY COLLEGE and the UNIVERSITY OF NEBRASKA AT OMAHA

INTRODUCTION

This articulation agreement is made and entered into by the University of Nebraska at Omaha, hereinafter referred to as UNO, and Kansas City Kansas Community College, hereinafter referred to as KCKCC. By this agreement KCKCC and UNO express a shared commitment to increasing opportunities for student access to and success in higher education. By clarifying transfer policies and procedures which assure articulation between programs, with this agreement the institutions seek to assist students in making a seamless transfer from the associate to the baccalaureate degree.

PURPOSE

This agreement pertains to the following degrees from UNO:

- Bachelor of General Studies with an Area of Concentration in:
 - Nonprofit Administration
 - Criminology and Criminal Justice
 - Political Science
 - Sociology

This agreement pertains to the following degrees from KCKCC:

- Associate in Arts in Liberal Arts and Sciences in:
 - Political Science
 - Pre-Public Administration
 - Sociology
- Associate in Applied Science in:
 - Addiction Counseling
 - Corrections
 - Early Childhood Education
 - Paralegal Education
 - Police Science
 - Victim/Survivor Services

CONDITIONS OF TRANSFER

UNO and KCKCC agree that, if a student completes an AA or AAS from KCKCC in one of the above areas of study, then he/she:


1. Will receive recognition of that degree toward the completion of the Bachelor of General Studies (BGS) degree offered by UNO through the College of Public Affairs and Community Service (CPACS) and its Division of Continuing Studies (DCS). A maximum of 64 semester hours of coursework may be applied toward the BGS degree.
 - a. Only courses completed with a grade of C- or better are transferable toward the BGS degree.
 - b. KCKCC courses numbered below 100 are not transferable to UNO.
 - c. Students will receive lower-division credit for all KCKCC transferable credits.
 - d. All student transcripts will be evaluated according to Program of Study sheets made available by CPACS/DCS.
2. Will be awarded the Bachelor of General Studies degree upon successful completion of:
 - a. Requirements in the area of concentration and secondary fields as stated in the UNO Undergraduate Catalog.
 - b. All other current graduation requirements as stated in the UNO Undergraduate Catalog, including, e.g., those pertaining to the minimum number of semester hours required for the degree (currently 120), general education, standards of progress, upper-division progress, upper-division hours, and hours in residence.

COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

In performing the obligations of this agreement, both parties shall comply with all applicable laws, rules, regulations, statutes and other legal requirements according to the jurisdictions of each party. For example, requirements of the state of Nebraska shall govern UNO; requirements of the state of Kansas shall govern KCKCC.

AMENDMENTS


This agreement is effective as of the most recent date attached to the signatures, below, and is effective until changed in writing by mutual agreement of both parties (KCKCC and UNO). This agreement may be amended at any time with the approval of both parties and is subject to regular review to assure currency with the respective degree requirements. Should either party desire to terminate this agreement, reasonable notice (ideally two years) and mutual discussion by authorized representatives of the parties is required. A notice of agreement to terminate shall be signed by appropriate representatives of both parties upon termination of this articulation agreement.







***The Kansas City Kansas Community College (KCKCC) – to – the University of Nebraska at Omaha (UNO)
Opportunity Scholarship***

1. The *KCKCC-to-UNO Opportunity Scholarship* is a renewable undergraduate scholarship designed especially for non-Nebraska resident KCKCC graduates enrolled in an online Bachelor of General Studies (BGS) Degree Program with a concentration in one of the areas listed below.
 - Nonprofit Administration
 - Criminology and Criminal Justice
 - Political Science
 - Sociology
2. To qualify for the *KCKCC-to-UNO Opportunity Scholarship*, a student must complete an Associate's Degree at KCKCC in one of the following areas below. (Students who earn a KCKCC Associate Degree in other fields will be evaluated on an individual basis.)

Addiction Counseling	Corrections
Early Childhood Education	Paralegal Education
Police Science	Political Science
Pre-Public Administration	Sociology
Victim/ Survivor Services	
3. For the 2012-13 academic year, the *KCKCC-to-UNO Opportunity Scholarship* reduces UNO tuition from \$375 to \$250 per credit hour for a non-Nebraska resident KCKCC graduate enrolled in an online Bachelor of General Studies Degree Program. The award covers \$125 per credit hour for up to 12 credits per semester per student.
4. Qualified applicants must be non-Nebraska residents and graduates of Kansas City Kansas Community College with a minimum, cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 from KCKCC.
5. To be eligible for scholarship renewal, the student must maintain a minimum, cumulative grade point average of 2.5 at UNO, must maintain residency in a state other than Nebraska, and must maintain enrollment in the online Bachelor of General Studies Degree Program. The scholarship recipient must enroll at UNO for consecutive semesters, with the exception of summer sessions, unless the Division of Continuing Studies waives this requirement based on extenuating circumstances presented by the student.
6. Eligible students may receive this scholarship each semester they are enrolled in courses until any one of the following occur – completion of degree coursework, completion of 120 credit hours, or attendance at UNO for five calendar years.
7. The scholarship may not be used for remedial or audit courses.
8. The Division of Continuing Studies oversees the scholarship selection process. Renewal of the KCKCC-to-UNO Opportunity Scholarship is at the discretion of the Division of Continuing Studies and is contingent, in part, upon the recipient meeting the requirements of the scholarship. Failure to comply with scholarship requirements could result in non-renewal.
9. Scholarship renewal is also dependent upon the yearly availability of funds.
