MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, by and between *USD458 – Basehor-Linwood, Basehor, Kansas* and *Kansas City Kansas Community College, Kansas City, Kansas* is made to provide students enrolling in the

Family and Community Services Pathway the option to earn Earned Credit in the Pre-Social Work, Associate of Applied Science degree

through Kansas City Kansas Community College. It is the intent of this cooperative effort to provide the student with a non-duplicative program of study leading to enhanced employment opportunities.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed by and between the parties as follows:

- 1. Earned credit may be granted through this joint agreement. The awarding of such credit is contingent upon the joint cooperation of the specific program by the two institutions.
- 2. Any courses articulated for Earned Credit are outlined in the table below. Restrictions for Earned Credit include:
 - a. The student must have a KCKCC current Application for Admission on file and must submit a high school transcript.
 - b. The student must have maintained a grade of "B" or better in the specified course for each grading interval as indicated on the high school transcript.
 - c. Earned Credit will be posted after 15 additional hours of *Kansas City Kansas Community College* have been successfully completed.
 - d. Credit will be posted on the KCKCC transcript as Family and Community Services Earned Credit and the grade will be posted as "P".
 - Earned Credit will be posted after completion of ENGL 101 Composition I, SOSC 107 Sociology, PSYC 101 Psychology, and SOSC 108 Sociology of the Family with a 2.0 or higher GPA (for those courses).
 - f. The name "Kansas City Kansas Community College" will appear on the transcript.
 - f. Credits may not apply toward the KCKCC residency requirement.
 - h. KCKCC will accept high school transcripts for credit up to 3 years after high school graduation.
 - Earned Credit will apply toward a KCKCC certificate or degree. Students desiring to transfer these courses to another institution are advised to check with the receiving institution to determine transferability.

- 3. Both parties may advertise the programs and will jointly advise the students that this option is available to them.
- 4. Students must complete 15 credits within the corresponding program with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher to be eligible for an Associate Degree. The college credits will be held in escrow for the student until the additional 15 credit hours are earned. It is the student's responsibility to apply for this credit. The student must provide both a high school transcript and certificate of completion for their coursework to the registrar's office when they have met this requirement.
- 5. No tuition charge will be assessed for the earned credit.
- 6. This agreement may be revised/modified by mutual agreement as needed, or in the event of cancellation, discontinuance or disapproval of any course or program by the Kansas State Department of Education or the Kansas Board of Regents.
- 7. The respective parties shall retain ownership in any physical facilities used to provide education under the agreement.
- 8. This agreement is subject to change or cancellation by the Legislature at any time in accordance with Article 6, Section 5 of the Kansas Constitution.
- 9. Both parties agree to evaluate this program on an annual basis and in the context of student benefits, program efficiency, and effectiveness.
- This agreement shall begin April 1, 2015, and shall be reviewed annually.
