All nominations due October 31, 2025

The Kansas City Kansas Community College Foundation is now accepting nominations for the 2026 Hall of Fame Awards.

The purpose of the Hall of Fame Awards and Scholarship Event is to recognize and honor those individuals and organizations who have dedicated their time, talents and lives to educating others, whether in the classroom or on the streets of life. Funds raised at the event support scholarships accommodating students of all ages to help achieve their goals and contribute to society, which in turn makes our city, state, and country a better place to live! Each individual has potential, and it's our job to be the catalyst by offering access and support through financial scholarships.

The criteria by which the Hall of Fame inductees will be selected are as follows:

- ▶ *Demonstrates a commitment to education and to Kansas City Kansas Community College*
- ▶ *Works to improve the quality of life in the community through their passion for education*
- ▶ *Strives to increase educational opportunities for others*
- ▶ *Supports significant changes that have improved the quality of education*
- ▶ *Can be an individual, organization, or company from the Mid-America Region*

No more than four nominees will be chosen according to the above criteria by the nominating committee and finalists presented to the selection committee. Qualified nominations that are not selected will be advanced for review in the following year, and for that year only.

Required documents for a complete submission:

- ▶ *Nomination Form*
- ▶ *One-page biography of the nominee*
- ▶ *Letters of Recommendation - Provide at least two letters of recommendation (no more than three) in support of your nomination written by separate entities.*

Nominations will NOT be considered until all required documents are submitted. Confirmation will be sent upon receiving documents to the email provided on the nomination form.

Inductees will be announced December 2025

Inductees into the Hall of Fame will be recognized at a formal induction ceremony to take place on April 17, 2026 at the KCKCC Dr. Thomas R. Burke Technical Education Center located at 6565 State Ave. Kansas City, KS 66102
